ON THE DAY OF YOUR INTERVIEW:

1. Go through the Consular entrance to the Embassy (on Novinsky Boulevard).
2. **Get a numbered ticket** from the Q-matic machine located just beyond the security check point in the entrance to the Consular section waiting room. Push the green button, marked “F”, and take the two slips dispensed by the machine.
3. **HAND THE INTERVIEW LETTER FROM NVC AND YOUR NUMBERED TICKET** to the consular assistant at window #5 or #6.
4. After you have checked in with the consular assistant, please take a seat in the Immigrant Visa waiting area. You will be called for your interview by your numbered ticket.

- **Children** immigrating with you must also be present at the interview.
- **Please note that no one may accompany applicants into the Embassy's visa waiting room. This includes American citizens, spouses, attorneys, sponsors, friends, and family members.**
- **Visa delivery.** Please submit **the original DHL airway bill** for **express delivery** of your visa after the interview. (See additional information below)
- **Tickets.** We strongly advise you not to buy tickets or make any travel arrangements before you receive a visa.
- **Fingerprint scanning.** The U.S. Embassy, Moscow collects ten fingerprints as a part of the application process for all immigrant visa applicants over the age of 14. Please make sure to reschedule the interview date if an applicant's fingers have any cuts or wounds.
- **Payment.** **UNLESS ALREADY PAID BY THE PETITIONER TO NVC**, the applicant must pay the immigrant visa application fee (**400** dollars for each applicant) **ON THE DAY OF THE INTERVIEW**, only **AFTER** an Embassy employee instructs you to do so. The Embassy accepts dollars and rubles. Credit cards are not accepted.

- Please read through these instructions before the interview and follow them carefully. **UNLESS ALREADY SUBMITTED TO NVC BY THE PETITIONER** all documents (originals/copies/translations) should be brought with the applicant **ON THE DAY OF THE INTERVIEW**.
- **Translations** must be notarized only when the original is in a language OTHER than Russian. (e.g., a translation from Ukrainian into English must be notarized; translation from Russian into English does not need to be notarized).

LIST OF DOCUMENTS:

(Should be prepared for EACH family member immigrating with you if not previously submitted to the National Visa Center)

Applicants with missing items may be required to return for a second interview

1. Biographical Form DS-230 filled out in English (part 1 and part 2).
2. Travel passport: original and a photocopy of the information page with the photo.
3. Birth certificate: original, photocopy, translation into English (about notarizing translations please see above).
4. Marriage certificate: original, photocopy, and translation into English. For married couples bring a copy and a translation for each spouse.
5. For those previously married: Divorce certificate/ death certificate of spouse, if applicable: original, photocopy, translation into English.
6. Applicants are required to submit police certificates (original and translation) in **ALL names (including maiden names)** as well as **ALL dates of birth that they have used**. The police certificate must contain references to **each place** (subject to the jurisdiction of the Russian Federation) in which the applicant lives or has lived for more than six months since their 16th birthday or must indicate that the applicant's name(s) have been checked against the central database of the Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs (MVD). This includes localities where applicants have lived during university studies. If the applicant was on military service, he/she should bring the certificate from the local draft board. **If an applicant has lived abroad for more than one year, a police certificate must also be submitted from the country in which he/she lived.**
7. The results of your medical exam in a sealed envelope. The medical exam must be conducted by one of the Embassy's panel physicians (See additional information below). It takes approximately two days to process the results of the medical exam. For more information regarding the medical exam please contact one of the medical centers directly.
8. **TWO COLOR NON-GLOSSY FULL-FACE** photos (50x50 mm) for visa. The eye level should be between 28mm and 35mm from the bottom. Do not wear hats or glasses when taking the picture. (Two additional pictures will be required for the medical examination.)
9. Immigrant visa application fee (see above for details).
10. **From the petitioner – a US citizen or Legal Permanent Resident:**
 - Affidavit of Support: form **I-864, ORIGINAL ONLY**.
 - Copy of tax returns for the last year (**W-2 and 1040**). If copies of tax returns are not available, provide transcripts from the IRS.

List of Panel Physicians

A medical examination should be conducted before the immigrant visa interview. The following is a list of the facilities in Moscow with panel physicians authorized to conduct such examination. When you go to a clinic, please be sure to bring the following: 2 color pictures 3X4 cm in size, travel passport and an extract from your medical history with the list of vaccinations you have received. The document should include a doctor's signature and stamp.

The results of the examination must be submitted to the Embassy at the interview in a sealed envelope. Please refer all questions about medical appointments and the examination, to the clinics directly.

DHL Delivery of Your Visa

The applicant will need to provide a prepaid DHL airway bill which will be used to deliver the visa once it is issued. To obtain a prepaid DHL airway bill, go to one of DHL offices (see the list below) **before the interview**. Please provide the DHL clerk with the **applicant's** name and case number starting with **MOS**. Fill in the address to which the visa should be delivered.

You **must** bring **THE ORIGINAL DHL AIRWAY BILL** to the interview.

US Embassy's Consular Section will send your visa to a DHL courier 2 – 3 days after your visa has been approved. After that your visa will be delivered to the address you provided. **Visas cannot be delivered to an address outside the Russian Federation**. Please make sure you provide the correct address for visa delivery.

DHL will be responsible for your visa during the delivery process.

Contact Information

The U.S. Embassy in Moscow does not accept direct calls from the public on visa-related matters. All information is provided by a user-pays call center. This service offers callers immediate access to a wide range of visa-related information and the possibility to speak to live operators from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Moscow time.

The initial cost of the service will be a flat rate of \$2.68 per minute with a three-minute minimum.
