



LGBTI Family Travel Tips

A safe family trip overseas starts with our Traveler's Checklist (travel.state.gov/travelerschecklist).

Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and intersex (LGBTI) travelers can face unique challenges when abroad. Many countries do not recognize same-sex marriage. More than 70 countries consider consensual same-sex sexual relations a crime, sometimes carrying severe punishment.

Before You Go:

- *Research Your Destination* - for LGBTI specific information visit travel.state.gov/destination
- *Update Your Passport* - make sure your name, photo, and gender correspond to your current gender identity.
- *Check Passport Validity* - some countries require a minimum of 6 months validity.



- *Take Important Documents* - includes legal, health, parentage and/or custody documents.
- *Carry Contact Details* - includes family/friends and nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.

While Abroad:

- Follow the laws of the countries you visit. Many consider same-sex sexual activity illegal.
- Be cautious of potential threats and entrapment risks.
- Some LGBTI-friendly resorts and neighborhoods do not reflect the attitudes in surrounding areas.

If You Need Help:

- Contact the nearest U.S. embassy or consulate.
- We will protect your privacy.
- Immediately ask the police to notify the U.S. embassy if arrested.
