



Medical Examination Information
U.S. Embassy Kigali

All applicants, including infants and children, must undergo a medical exam and vaccinations to immigrate to the United States. Please schedule your medical exam no later than one week prior to your appointment time to ensure the exam results are ready before your interview. You should hand carry the results of your medical exam in the sealed envelope to your interview appointment. You are responsible for the cost of the medical exam.

K visa applicants and refugee and asylee applicants are exempted from vaccination requirements but must still complete the rest of the medical exam.

The medical examinations must be performed by the Panel Physician selected by the U.S. Embassy:

NO OTHER MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS ARE ACCEPTABLE FOR VISA PURPOSES.

The cost of the medical examination is estimated as follows, payable in RWF, at the time of your appointment:

Applicants 15 years and older:	\$95
Applicants under 15 years:	\$65

Any vaccines that you require will be at an additional cost, in addition to the medical exam fee. Some cases may require additional treatments or follow-up examinations which can incur additional costs. Payment for the medical exam is to be directly handled by the physician and the applicant.

Please note:

- All applicants must bring photo identification (passport or national ID card) to their medical exam appointment, as well as four (4) visa photographs. These photographs may be of the smaller size that is common in Kigali.
- Please bring records of any vaccinations you have previously received. [Vaccinations are required](#) for immigration to the United States. Any vaccines that you require will be at an additional cost, in addition to the medical exam fee.
- The HIV blood test is no longer a requirement for immigration to the U.S. However, you may request the Panel Physician to test you for HIV for your own knowledge. Results of that test will be included on the paperwork, but an HIV-positive status is not an inadmissible condition.
