MEDICAL APPOINTMENT INFORMATION

Prior to visa approval, each applicant for an immigrant visa must undergo a medical examination by an approved physician. Visa applicants are responsible for arranging an examination by one of the approved physicians before the scheduled visa interview.

The U.S. Embassy in Paris maintains a panel of two approved physicians who speak English and French:

An immigrant visa WILL NOT be issued until the U.S. Consul has reviewed the results of the medical examination for each applicant.

Please carefully review the list of required CDC vaccines. No medical report will be released until all vaccination requirements are met. Vaccinations should be done before the medical and an up-to-date vaccination record should be presented to the doctor on the day of the medical examination.

Each panel physician charges the same fixed fee. The total fee for adults is € 300. This fee covers the clinical examination, a chest X-ray and required blood tests. The fee for children under 15 is € 130. Children are not required to undergo X-rays or blood tests.

Applicants should discuss methods of payment with the physician at the time they schedule their appointment. It is our understanding that the costs of immigrant medical examinations are not paid by the French social security system.

VISITE MEDICALE

Chaque candidat à l'immigration doit se soumettre à une visite médicale chez un médecin agréé par le Service d'Immigration américain. Il appartient à chaque demandeur d'obtenir un rendez-vous et de passer une visite médicale auprès de l'un des médecins agréés, avant la date de l'entretien avec l'officier consulaire.

Le visa d'immigration ne peut être délivré avant la réception et l'examen du dossier médical de chaque demandeur par un officier consulaire.

Veillez prendre connaissance de la liste des vaccins exigés par le CDC. Aucuns rapports médicaux ne seront divulgués tant que tous les vaccins requis n'auront été effectués. Les vaccins doivent être complétés avant l'examen médical et un carnet à jour doit être présenté au médecin le jour de la consultation.

Les honoraires sont identiques pour chacun des médecins agréés :

- pour un adulte, le montant des honoraires est de € 300 et comprend l'examen clinique, les tests sanguins et une radiographie pulmonaire.
- pour tout enfant âgé de moins de 15 ans, les honoraires s'élèvent à € 130. Aucun test sanguin ou radiographie pulmonaire n'est requis.

Les demandeurs doivent se renseigner, au moment où le rendez-vous est fixé, sur les conditions de paiement acceptées par le médecin. Le coût des examens pratiqués pour l'obtention du visa d'immigrant n'est pas remboursé par la Sécurité Sociale française.

O visto não será processado até o Consul revisar os resultados do exame médico de cada candidato. No dia do exame médico, os candidatos devem fazer-se acompanhar do boletim de vacinas, eventual medicação crónica e relatório(s) do seu médico assistente ou especialista no caso de sofrerem de patologias crónicas. Qualquer vacina requerida poderá ser obtida através do médico.

Os honorários são os mesmos para todos os médicos autorizados:

Adultos- 228 euros- incluindo exame clínico, radiografia do torax, exames de sangue e urina requeridos.

Crianças com menos de 15 anos – 77.50 euros- as crianças não necessitam fazer o exame de sangue, urina e a radiografia, excepto se indicação médica para tal após o exame.

Os candidatos devem resolver o pagamento dos honorários médicos com o proprio médico no momento em que eles marcam a consulta.

Os candidatos podem também fazer a consulta em Paris com um dos médicos autorizados.

Updated Vaccination Requirements for Immigrants

DGMQ and Vaccines:

CDC's Division of Global Migration and Quarantine (DGMQ) writes Technical Instructions for medical examinations of immigrants and refugees. Proof of vaccination is a required part of the immigrant assessment to protect the public and individuals from specific preventable diseases.

New Vaccination Criteria for Immigrants:

DGMQ put new vaccination criteria in place for immigrants on December 14, 2009. These criteria allow DGMQ to decide which Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)-recommended vaccines should be required for U.S. immigration. Certain vaccines are required by name in the law, and these new criteria do not apply to them.

DGMQ uses the criteria for ACIP-recommended vaccines at regular periods, as needed, to decide which vaccines will be required for U.S. immigration:

- The vaccine must be age-appropriate* for the immigrant applicant, AND
- The vaccine must protect against a disease that has the potential to cause an outbreak, OR
- The vaccine must protect against a disease that has been eliminated or is in the process of being eliminated in the United States.

**ACIP recommends vaccines for the general U.S. population. These ACIP recommendations are used to decide which vaccines are age-appropriate for immigrant applicants.*

New Vaccination Requirements:

As of December 14, 2009, proof of vaccination against these diseases is required*:

- Haemophilus influenzae type B (Hib)
- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B
- Influenza
- Measles, Mumps, and Rubella
- Meningococcal Disease
- Pneumococcal Disease
- Polio
- Rotavirus
- Tetanus, Pertussis, and Diphtheria
- Varicella

**As of December 14, 2009 the human papillomavirus (HPV) and zoster vaccines are not required for immigrants.*

General Vaccination Tips:

- For vaccines that entail a series of doses, only one dose is required for admission to the United States.
- Multiple vaccines may be given simultaneously, but multiple body sites should be used.

Department of State (DS)-3025 Vaccination Documentation Worksheet:

- The panel physician should not sign the Worksheet until after vaccines are administered.
- Every row should have at least one check mark.
- Most applicants will require a blanket waiver (no application needed).
- The panel physician should provide a copy of the DS-3025 Worksheet directly to each applicant.
