IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL APPLICANTS SCHEDULED FOR IMMIGRANT VISA INTERVIEWS IN REYKAVIK, ICELAND

After you have received the date and time of your immigrant visa interview from the National Visa Center (NVC), read these instructions for information on what is required before and during the interview.

Each applicant must appear in person, but the petitioner is not required to attend.

GATHER THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS FOR YOUR VISA INTERVIEW APPOINTMENT:

Bring the following documents to your visa interview. You must bring these documents to the visa interview for the consular officer to review even if you submitted a photocopy of them to NVC. Make sure you have the **original** plus a clear photocopy of each document.

- NVC's interview appointment letter
- Unexpired passport that is valid for six months beyond your intended date of entry into the United States and a photocopy of the biographic page (where your name and photo are located)
- 2 color passport-size pictures (5cm x 5cm or 2 inch x 2inch)
- Medical exam results in sealed envelope
- Confirmation page of DS-260 Application for an Immigrant Visa that you submitted on ceac.state.gov
- Original Birth Certificate
- Original Marriage/Divorce Certificate (if applicable)
- Original Police Certificate/ Court Records (if 16 years or older)
- Original Military Records (if applicable)
- Originally signed (in ink) Affidavit of Support from your petitioner and any additional financial sponsors who submitted a Form I-864 on behalf of your visa application, along with a photocopy of the sponsor's most recent IRS transcript or the most recent Federal income tax return and W-2s (for family-based cases)

- Proof of the U.S. petitioner's status and domicile in the U.S. (photocopy of a U.S. passport, naturalization certificate, or legal permanent resident card). (For family-based cases)
- A letter from your U.S. employer dated less than 1 month ago confirming the essential elements of the job offer. (For employee-based cases)

DO NOT BRING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING ITEMS TO THE EMBASSY:

- Electronic devices (such as cell phones, laptop computers, cameras, iPods, MP3 players, etc.)
- Weapons or tools
- Backpacks, suitcases or other large bags
- Food or beverages of any kind (except for milk for babies).

MEDICAL EXAMINATION IS REQUIRED BEFORE YOUR VISA INTERVIEW:

***Important:* Immigrant visa applicants must complete (schedule and attend) a medical examination with an authorized physician before their scheduled visa interview.**

If you complete your medical examination after your visa interview, processing of your immigrant visa case will be delayed until the U.S. embassy has received your medical examination results. Therefore, applicants are strongly encouraged to complete their medical exams prior to their visa interviews. IMPORTANT NOTICE:

No assurance can be given that your immigrant visa will be issued. Do not finalize arrangements for travel to the United States, dispose of properties, or resign from your job until a visa has been issued and delivered to you. Generally, an immigrant visa is valid for six months from the date of issuance, unless its validity is limited by medical or other restrictions. If approved, applicants can generally pick up their passports the week following the interview.
